ACTIVE TRAVEL

Excursions on this program require:

- ▶ walking distances up to 3-5 miles
- ▶ walking on cobblestones, unpaved paths and/or uneven surfaces
- ▶ getting on/off motor coaches, boats and trains
- ▶ navigating stairs to get in/out of Métro stations

Following World War I, many African American expatriates found acceptance and opportunities in Paris. During carefully curated excursions, trace the path of Black performers, literary greats and luminaries who were instrumental in shaping French culture. See famous Parisian hangouts, enjoy a jazz concert, cruise the Seine River and delight in delectable French cuisine. Return home with an understanding of the contributions and influences made by African American expatriates.

Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day 1 | In Transit

Depart for Paris, France. 🌐

Day 2 | Paris, France

Arrive in Paris. Transfer 🚗 and check in to your hotel, Les Jardins du Marais.

Welcome to Paris! Join your AHI Travel Director for a discovery of the neighborhood around your hotel and learn how to use the Métro.

Gather for a Welcome Reception and Dinner tonight.

Day 3 | Paris

Paris' African American History. The day begins with an enriching city tour. Head out to uncover the Paris that welcomed Josephine Baker, Langston Hughes and other African American luminaries. See the haunts of W.E.B. Du Bois, James Baldwin and others as you ride along the Champs-Élysées, drive through the Latin Quarter and visit other vibrant and historic districts. Your guide shares insights into the connection between Black heritage and important landmarks, including the Palais Garnier, the Moulin Rouge, the Louvre and more. Dig into sensational French cuisine over lunch.

Free Time: Spend the afternoon crafting your own adventures through Paris.

Day 4 | Paris

AHI Connects: Paris Noir. Watch an illuminating documentary that explores the relationship between Paris and African American expatriates in the time after World War I. A question-and-answer session with the filmmakers follows the screening.

Montmartre and Jazz Walking Tour. Explore the colorful streets of Montmartre. Along the way, learn about the influence of the Harlem Renaissance and jazz on Paris, and see clubs owned by jazz legends.

Free Time: An afternoon of leisure offers opportunities to discover Paris' excellent food, boutiques and more.



Day 5 | Paris

Flavors of France. Experience the nuances of French gastronomy during a walking tour. Visit local shops, and taste excellent artisan-made foods, sweets and wines.

Musée du quai Branly. Join an expert for a tour through one of Paris' premier cultural institutions. This museum features collections focused on non-European cultures with a variety of art, artifacts and objects from Oceania, Asia, Africa and the Americas.

Day 6 | Paris

Free Time: The day is yours to explore Paris! Pave your path through legendary landmarks, museums and parks. Stroll along the famous Champs-Élysées to the Arc de Triomphe, or visit the magnificent Eiffel Tower.

Elective | Versailles. Uncover the splendor of France's grandest palace. During a guided tour, witness the palace's ornate décor, painted ceilings, rich tapestries and luxurious galleries. See the Hall of Mirrors, the lavishly decorated room where the Treaty of Versailles was signed, and roam the elaborate gardens.

Jazz Experience. A splendid night awaits! During an evening stroll, trace the evolution of French jazz in St-Germain-des-Prés and the Latin Quarter. Listen to stories of great musicians. Then settle in at a jazz club to enjoy a delicious dinner, followed by a jazz concert.

Day 7 | Paris

Enrichment: An African American Writer in Paris Today. Award-winning writer Jake Lamar, a Bronx transplant in Paris, discusses his experiences in Paris. A Harvard University graduate and former writer for Time magazine, Lamar has written six novels, a play, a memoir and many short stories.

Pioneers of the Left Bank. From the Place du Panthéon to La Sorbonne, follow a storied path through the Left Bank, passing landmarks steeped in artistic innovation and political debate. Along the way, learn about the rich history of the Négritude movement, which rose to prominence in the 1930s in the lecture halls of the Sorbonne. See the former home of



Richard Wright, author of the groundbreaking novel "Native Son."

Join your group for another extraordinary lunch.

Free Time: The afternoon is at leisure. You may wish to wander the vast corridors of the Louvre or gaze at works by Monet, van Gogh and Renoir in the Musée d'Orsay, located in the old Gare d'Orsay railway station.

Day 8 | Paris

Paris by Boat. Get a different perspective of glorious Paris on a memorable Seine River cruise. Glide along the storied waterway, viewing the iconic Notre-Dame Cathedral, the Louvre Museum, Île Saint-Louis and other renowned landmarks along the riverbanks.

Free Time: Enjoy an afternoon in Paris. Scout for souvenirs or relax in the Jardin du Luxembourg. Tonight, raise a toast to celebrate your time together at a Farewell Reception, followed by a Farewell Dinner.

Day 9 | In Transit

Transfer to the Paris airport for the return flight to your gateway city.

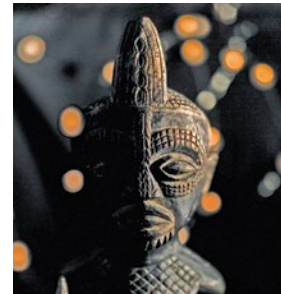
